- All subsequent published revisions, the provisions of which will take precedence.
- An arbitration procedure is provided for in the FEI Statutes and General Regulations referred to above. In accordance with this procedure, any appeal against a decision rendered by the FEI or its official bodies is to be settled exclusively by the Court of Arbitration for Sport (CAS) in Lausanne, Switzerland.



THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. **The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.**

V. KRC Point System

1. Registration

- a. Rider / Horse combination may compete in one category only.
- b. Once the rider / horse moves to a higher category, the points of the lower category will be omitted, and the new category points will be counted.
- c. Riders may compete in more than one category.
 - i. **Category D** riders are not allowed to accumulate points in any other category.

2. Class & Categories

- a. There are four (4) Categories:
 - i. Beginner Tour
 - ii. Small Tour
 - iii. Medium Tour
 - iv. Big Tour
- b. Heights and points:

3. Point Calculation

- a. The Best 80% of the competitions a rider competes in are calculated towards his points.
 - i. Ex. Season has 14 competitions, only best 11 competitions will be counted.
 - ii. This rule will give a chance for riders with resting or injured horses/ riders or riders willing to compete internationally to still collect points in the KRC Point System.
- b. Points will be calculated for the following types of classes:
 - i. Two Phases, Jump Off, Speed, Team Relay, and Accumulator.
